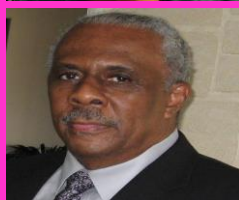

Owings Mills Mall - Site Plans

The Owings Mills Mall has been demolished, and it will soon be redeveloped into the third element of what Baltimore County Councilman Julian Jones called the "Triple Crown" for the area.

Speaking before a packed house at the Owings Mills Library, Jones told his constituents that the mall site would complete the trifecta of attractions for the community, which also contains the Metro Centre at Owings Mills and Foundry Row, both of which are in development.

Jones said he hoped that ground would break this summer for the outdoor stores that would be coming to the now vacant mall site. While owner Kimco was still inking the deals, Jones said he believed that several retailers had signed on to a new endeavor at the Owings Mills Mall for an outdoor shopping destination. "It's going to be bigger than Hunt Valley," Jones said of the plan, which includes big-box stores and restaurants. A home improvement business, sporting goods store and possibly a membership-only shopping warehouse could be on the horizon, Jones said, adding that agreements had not been finalized. According to Jones, the AMC Theater nearby will also get \$6 million in improvements to make it state-of-the-art

- .. Tips for walking safely
 - .. Always cross at traffic lights or marked crosswalks
 - .. Obey traffic signals at all times
 - .. Stay alert when crossing, even with walk signal
 - .. Try to make eye contact with driver
 - .. Walk on sidewalk whenever possible
 - .. No sidewalk, walk on side facing traffic
 - .. Wear bright or reflective clothes at night
- .. **AVOID DISTRACTIONS**
 - .. Put away your cell phone
 - .. Turn off headphones

Pedestrian Laws

- . At intersection, subject to all traffic control signals

BALTIMORELINK - A complete overhaul and rebranding of the core transit system operating within the city and throughout the greater Baltimore region. The MTA bus network had many routes that were antiquated, served outdated job locations and were too long to manage reliably, especially those that traverse downtown Baltimore and compounded congestion. A more efficient and reliable bus network was implemented by spreading out the routes within the downtown core and creating a grid of high-frequency routes to Improve service and reliability;

- Maximizes access to high-frequency transit;
- Strengthens connections between MTA bus and rail routes;
- Aligns the network with existing and emerging job centers; and
- Engaged riders, employees, communities, and elected officials in the planning process.

The committee is expected to complete its work by August 30th and report to the Executive Board the Slate of Officers:

According to the SIA By-Laws, at the October 11, 2017 General Meeting, the Slate of Officers will be presented by the Chairperson of the Nominating Committee. Then, the President can call for nominations from the floor for any of the positions beginning with the office of the president and ending with the office of the treasurer. Nominees must be present and must agree to have their names placed on the ballot. According to the By-Laws, this process ends at this point.

If the ballot reflects only one candidate for each office, there can be a voice vote for the slate. If at least one office has two or more candidates, then there will be a secret ballot vote. The official ballot will appear in Volume 11, Issue 1 Winter Edition of the Stevenswood Connection Newsletter.
